

By Virtue of a Writ dated the 29th day of August 1744 There was Resurveyed for Thomas Jenks a Certain Tract of Land Situate in Middletown in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Small Hickery Standing by a great Run Thence North by the Land of John Hough Seventy four Perches to a post. Thence North West One Hun Hundred & Fifteen Perches to a Black Oak, Thence West by South Eighty Perches to a Black Oak Standing in Musgroves Line Thence along the Said Line South by East One Hundred Seventy four Perches to a Stool over Cove Creek Thence East by John Cawleys Land Eighty perches to a Stone Thence North Seventeen perches to an Old poplar Tree Standing by the Side of the said great Run Thence up the Severall Courses thereof to the place of Beginning Containing One Hundred and forty five Acres.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this 28th day of January 1909
