up five hundred Acres of Land in right of Mary Southwo^{rth} Purchaser
of five hundred Acres These are to require thee forthwith to Survey
or cause to be Surveyed unto him the S^d Jn^o Parker the Said Number
of five hundred Acres (according to ye Method of Townships
by me appointed) of Land in this Province not already Surveyed nor
taken up nor concealed, nor seated by the Indians, He Seating and
Improving the Same within twelve Months after the Date of
Survey of w^{ch} make Returns into my Secretaries Office,
Given under my hand and Seal at Philad^{ia} the 3^d day of the
7th Month 1701.

of ye Province of Pensilvania & Territories

Mem^{dum} that ye Liberty Land being ~~already~~ already
granted viz 8 Acres there is but 492 Acres to be laid out to him
