

By Vertue of the Commission<sup>rs</sup> Warrant dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the 5<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>t</sup>  
 1714 Surveyed and laid out unto David Powel a certaine Tract of Land <sup>\*</sup> within  
 the County of Philadelphia Begining at a black Oak Saplin in the line of  
 the Land belonging to the London Comp<sup>a</sup>. Thence South East by the  
 Same Land one hundred perches to a post for another Corner,  
 Thence North East by Va Land three hundred and twenty perch  
 to a post, Thence North West one hundred perches to a post,  
 Thence South West by Vacant Land three hundred and twenty perches  
 unto the first mentiond Corner Marked black Oak Saplin containing  
 two hundred acres of Land Surveyed the 30<sup>th</sup> of the 5<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>t</sup> 1714.
