where not already taken up according to y<sup>e</sup> Method of Townships appointed  
by me, he seating & improving y<sup>e</sup> Same w<sup>th</sup>in One Year from y<sup>e</sup> Date of  
Survey, & make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office.
