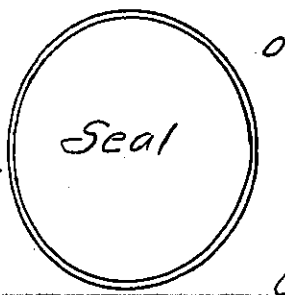

At the Request of Christopher Pennock, That I would
grant him to take up One hundred Acres of Liberty Land
in behalf of Rich^d Pierce, James Craven, Thomas Pierce,
Thomas ffelps & Sam^l Taverner old Joint Purchasers of
five thousand Acres; These are to require thee forthwith to
Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto him the Said Number of
Acres in the Liberty Lands of Philadelphia beyond Skuy Kill,
He or they clearing the same th within three years after date of
Survey and make Returns thereof into my Secret^{ries} Office
Given under my Hand & Seal at Philad^{ia} the 18th day
of ye 5th Moth 1700.
