

By virtue of a Gen' Warr^t from the Commiss^{rs} of property bearing date the 5th of the ^{mo} 11 1702. Resurvey'd the 29th of the 4th month 1703 a Certain Tract of Land Scituate in Soulburry Township in the County of Bucks formerly laid out to Richard Burgess. Beginning at a Small White oak by Delaware River at the Corner of Bassilean ffosters land - Then by the Same South one hundred perches to a Small Black oak again by the Said ffosters land West two hundred and fifty nine perches to a Black oak - Then by Henry Paxon's land North 3 degrees easterly one hundred and Eighty perches to a post by the said River then down the Same on Several Courses three hundred and eleven Perches to the Beginning Containing three hundred acres.
