Bucks or Chester, of Land not yet taken up, the aforesaid
number of Acres according to the Method of Townships by me
appointed, Two distinct Settlements to be made thereon, within
one year after it shall be Laid out. And make Return thereof
into my Secretaries Office, Given at Philadelphia y^e 2^d day
of the 2^d moth 1700.
