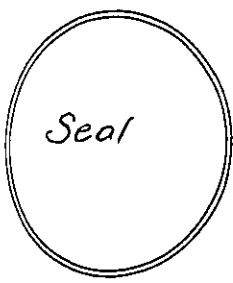


Pensilvania S.S.

These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Anthony Burton according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said Quantity of one Hundred Acres of Land in the Said Province that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians & make a Returne thereof into the Secretary's Office in Order to a further Confirmation - Given under our Hands & Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 5<sup>th</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> month Anno Di 1714/5
