At the Request of Thomas Bye and Margaret his Wife Attornye for Edw^d Simkins, That we would grant them to take up for the S^d Edward two hundred & fifty Acres of Land originally purchased by him of the Propriet^{rs} These are to Authorize thee forthwith to survey or cause to be Survey'd to the S^d Edw^d Simpkins the S^d Number of two hundred and fifty Acres of Land not already Survey'd nor taken up nor Concealed nor Seated by the Indians, and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office, Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 7th day of the 11th Moth 1701.
