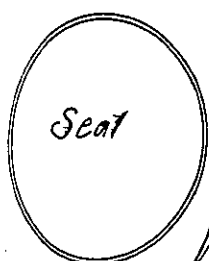


Pensilvania



William Penn Proprietary and Govern^r of the Province
of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Thomas Bye That I would grant him to take up
two hundred Acres of Land in right and as part of three hundred
Acres granted by my Self to Sam^l Martin of whom he purchased
the Same, These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or
cause to be Survey'd according to y^e Methods of Townships
by me appointed to the S^d Thomas Bye the S^d number of
two hundred Acres of Land not already Survey'd nor taken
up nor concealed nor Seated by the Indians, and make Returns
there of into my Secretaries Office.
