



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Comm^{rs} to me directed bearing date the 10th of the first month 1702 to execute all Warr^{ts} directed to Phineas Pemberton and not executed, And pursuant to a Warr^t from Edw: Penington Survey^r Gen^l to the Said Phineas Pemberton dated the 10th of the 10th month 1701 for 200 ac: in Right of Samuel Martin And pursuant to a Warr^t from the S^d Comm^{rs} to the Said Phineas date the 7th of the 11th month 1701 for 250 ac: in Right of Edward Simkins, Surveyed and Laid out unto Thomas Bye a Tract of Land in Soulbury Township in the County of Bucks, Beginning at a heap of Stones by a Small White oak Marked for a Corner, Thence by John Scarborough's land N.E. 324 perches to a Post by a Small white oak, Then S.E. by Great Spring & Vacant Land 219 per to a Corner marked black Oak Saplin, Then by the Mannor of Highlands S.W. 324 perches to a Great White Oak, Then by Vacant N.W. 219 perches to the beginning, Containing 438 Acres, (12 acres being deducted for Liberty Lands) Surveyed the 10th day of the 8th month 1702.
