 Purchase of three thousand Acres of Land made of the Proprietor
 in England. These are to Authorize and Require thee to
 Survey and lay out to the sd. George Beale the quantity of one
 thousand Acres of Land between the Rivers Delaware and
 Susquehannagh in this Province according to Agreem^t where
 not already Survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor Seated by the
 Indians. And make Returns into the General Surveyors Office
 at Philadelphia where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof
 to be delv'd to thee Certified by the Secretary. Given under our
 hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 25th of
 the 4th Moth 1705.
