



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Comm<sup>rs</sup> to me — directed bearing date the 5<sup>th</sup> / <sup>11<sup>th</sup></sup> / 1702 to Resurvey all the Tracts or parcels of land within the County of Bucks which may be reasonably suspected to have been unduely Surveyed (When first taken up) and have not yet been rectified, Resurveyed unto John Baldwin a Tract of Land in Makefield township in Bucks County Beginning at a Post being Samuel Baker's Corner, Thence West by Ralph Miller's land one hundred and Six perches to a Post, Then by Vacant land North two hundred and Eleven perches to a Hickery, Then by vacant — East one hundred and Six perches to a Hickery, Then South by Samuel Baker's land two hundred and Eleven perches to the place of beginning Containing one hundred thirty nine acres and one hundred and twenty six perches. Resurveyed the Sixteenth day of the Eighth month 1703.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this Fourteenth day of JULY 1909
