

Whereas by our Warr<sup>t</sup> bearing date the 4<sup>th</sup> day of the Second Month 1706. We granted to Sam' Cart to take up Six hundred and Sixty Nine Acres remaining unsurvey'd of one thousand acres Originally purchased by Edw. Martin dale of — Bristol and by him conveyed to Joshua Cart the Said Samuel's Father. Since the date of wh<sup>t</sup> Warr<sup>t</sup> there is discovered a certain Tract of four hundred Acres lying between the Lands of Benjamin East and James Claypoole near Neshaminy Creek in the County of Bucks appropriated to the sd Purchase and now of right belonging to the sd Samuel. These therefore are to require thee to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd the sd Tract of Land according to the true Bounds thereof and return the same in the right afores'd into the Secretarie's Office. Also to cause the remaining 269 Acres of the sd purchase to be laid out & returned according to the Tenour of our afores<sup>d</sup> Warr<sup>t</sup>. Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>la</sup> the 23<sup>d</sup> day of Septemb<sup>r</sup> 1707
