



By virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing date the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the first month 171<sup>3/4</sup> Resurveyed unto Henry Comley a tract of Land lying in Warminster Township in Bucks County Beginning at a black Oak in the Line between Philadelphia County and Bucks County being Samuel Carpenter's Corner from thence running North East by Samuel Carpenter's Land three hundred perches to a White Oak, Then by Jonas Jones Land <sup>South East</sup> One hundred & Seventy perches to a Post, Then South West by Nicholas Gilbert's Land three hundred perches to a Post in the afore S<sup>d</sup>. County Line. Then by the S<sup>d</sup> Line North West one hundred & Seventy perches to the place of beginning Containing three hundred acres with allowance for Roads at 6<sup>th</sup> p Cent. Resurveyed the 9<sup>th</sup> day of the 2<sup>d</sup> Month 1714.
