Also a Town Lott Contiguous to the Said Tract Beginning at a post by the Common, thence West by North by Samuel Houghs line one hundred forty eight perches to a post, Thence north by east forty three perches to a post, Thence east by South by Israel Morris his line one hundred fifty three perches to a post, Thence South 16 deg West by the Common forty four perches to the place of beginning Containing forty acres the Sum of both is four hundred and forty Acres.
