

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property dated the 18th of
 12th month 1703 for Resurveying unto John Morgan of Radnor in the Welch Tract
 four hundred and fifty acres of land in the said Township, one hundred thereof
 in Right of John Evans, one hundred more in Right of Ellis Jones and two
 hundred and fifty in Right of Edward Jones all mean purchasers under
 Richar- Davice first purchaser of 5000 acres.

Resurvey'd unto the said John Morgan a Tract of land in the sd Town-
 ship of Radnor beginning a post at the corner of the Widow Germans Land
 thence by the ~~to~~ lands of David Evans and Hughs North north west one
 one hundred and fifty four perches to a post Then East North east by the

 thirty nine perches to a post Then by the ~~by~~ the Widow Germans' land west
 south west four hundred seventy four perches to the beginning Containing
 Three hundred seventy six acres.
