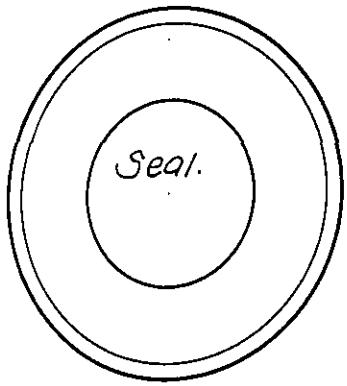


Pensylvania SS.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of William Middleton that we would Grant him to take up near Pecque Creek in the County of Chester one hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors Use Ten pounds Money of Pensylvania and ye yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for the Same. These are to authorize & require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said William Middleton in or near the place aforesaid the <sup>sd</sup> quantity of one hundred acres of Land that has not been already Surveyed nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which Survey in case the said William fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 30<sup>th</sup> day of the fourth Month Anno Dni. 1718.
