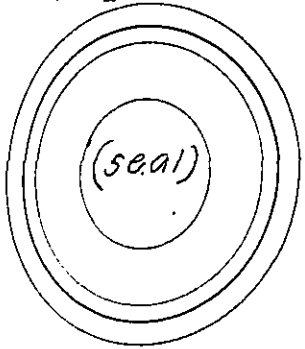


Pensylvania ss:



By the Commission^{ers} of Property.

At the Request of John Martin of the County of Chester who came into this Province a servant to Nathaniel Evans in the Year 1681 That we would Grant him to take up his Right and proportion of Headland according to the Proprietars Original Concessions to Servants: These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the said John Martin according to the Method of Townships appointed fifty Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed, nor Seated by the Indians to be held under the Yearly quitrent of a half penny Sterling for every Acre and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the ~~the~~ 4th day of ye 2^d Month (April) in the 6th Year of the Reign of Queen Anne A.D. 1707.
