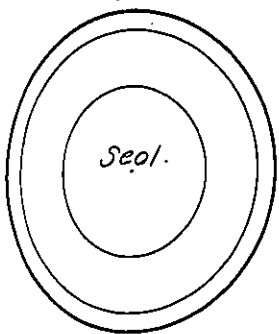


Pensylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of John Moor of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up back in the said County the quantity of Two hundred Acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet^{rs} Use Twenty Pounds Money of Pensylvania for the whole & within three Months after the date hereof and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said John Moor in the back Part of the said County, ^{towards Susquehanna} according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Two hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by ye Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which survey in case the said John fulfill the above agreement shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & Seal of ye Province at Philad^a ye 25th of ye 1st mo. A.D. 1718.
