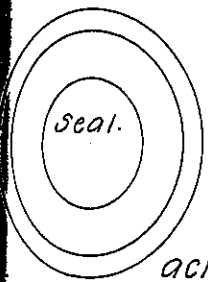


Pennsylvania ss:



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Mordecai Maydock of Chester County that we would Grant him to take up the Quantity of three hundred Seventy five acres of Land the purchase made of the late Proprietor by Henry Maydock father of the said Mordecai by Deed dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the fifth Month Anno Dni. 1691 and since Descended to him by Inheritance or otherwise These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd in Right of the aforesaid Purchase (towards Susquehanna River) according to the method of Townships appointed the said Quantity of three hundred Seventy five Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the first day of December Anno Dni. 1720.
