

By virtue of a warrant from the Commiss<sup>rs</sup> of Property Dated the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 1706 to Survey unto Jno Powel and Sam<sup>l</sup> Robinet two hundred and sixty five acres of Land in Right of Wm Taylor's purchase of Six hundred and twenty five acres which Quantity of two hundred sixty five acres being the Remainder of the said purchase untaken up The said William Taylor by his last Will Left to his Daughters Elizabeth and Mary ye Wives of the said Powel & Robinet

There was Surveyd and Laid out the first of the third Month 1707 to the said John Powel and Samuel Robinet the said Quantity of two hundred and sixty five acres of Land in Sadberry Township in the County of Chester Beginning at a White Oak in a Line of Sarah Weights Land and Running by the said Sarah Weights Land North two hundred and twenty perches to a Chesnut tree Thence West by Vacant Land one hundred ninety four perches to a White Oak Then North two hundred and twenty perches to a post Then East by Vacant land one hundred ninety four perches to to place of ~~the~~ Beginning
