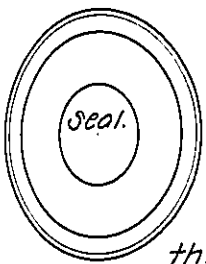


Pensilvania ss:

By the Commissioners of Property.



At the Request of Owen O'Neal late of Philadelphia that we would
Grant him to take up near Pecque Creek for a Settlement for himself and family
the quantity of Two hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the
Proprietors use Twenty Pounds Mory of Pensilvania for the whole and the Yearly
quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and
Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Owen O'Neal in the
place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said quantity
of Two hundred acres of Land that has not been already Surveyed nor approp-
riated nor is Seated by ye Indians and make Returns thereof into the Sec-
retarys Office which Survey in case the Said Owen fulfill the above agree-
ment within three Months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the
Same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Giv-
en under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelp^a the 30th day of ye
4th month Anno Dⁿⁱ 1718.
