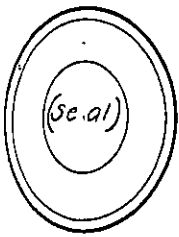


Pennsylvania S.S.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Griffith Philip that we would Grant him to take up Fifty acres of Land joyning to the Land late Richard Thomas's at the upper End of the Great Valley for which he Doth agree to pay to the Proprietors use Seven pounds ten Shillings within Six weeks after the Date hereof and six pence Sterling for a Quitrent Yearly for the Same These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Griffith Philip according to the Method of Townships appointed the Said Quantity of Fifty Acres of Land in the Place aforesaid that has not already been Survey'd nor appropriated And make a Return thereof into the Secretary's Office in order to a further Confirmation which Survey in case the Said Griffith fulfill the above agreement shall be Valid otherwise the Same to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever Granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 10<sup>th</sup> day of ye fourth Month Anno Dni 1714.
