At the Request of George Pierce of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up two Hundred and twenty five acres of Land Joyning to the Land lately laid out to him at Octoraro Creek for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Two and Twenty pounds ten Shillings for the whole and the usual Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres and Soe Proportionable for the Rest These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said George Pierce in the Place ofore said the said Quantity of Two Hundred and Twenty five Acres of Land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said George Pierce fulfill the above agreement at the Location shall be Valid otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made or this warrant ever granted Given under our hands and Seale of the Province at Philadelphia the 30th day of the 7th month Anno Dni. 1714.


