



By virtue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Surveyor General bearing date y<sup>e</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> mo. 1701, directed unto me I hereby Certify into his Office that I have Resurveyed the 3<sup>d</sup> of the 4<sup>th</sup> mo. Ensueing unto Evan Prythry a Certain tract of Land in the Township of Radnor in the County of Chester begining at a Stake Neere a black oak marked <sup>in</sup> a Line deviding it from Morris Lwelinst Land from thence by a Line of marked trees and same Land west south west 320<sup>r</sup> perches to Darby Creek from thence by the severall Courses up the said Creek 64 perches to a Line deviding it from Thomas John Evans Land from thence by a Line of marked trees and same Land East north east 336 perches to a stake in a Line of Steven ap Evans Land from then by a Line of marked trees south: south east 60 perches to the first place of begining containing one hundred and twenty and two acers & 34<sup>r</sup> perches.
