

By virtue of a warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property dated y^e 30th day of the 9th month 1702 for surveying unto Joseph Pike 700 acres in y^e County of Chester.

Surveyd and laid out y^e 9th of the 2^d month 1703 unto Joseph Pike seven hundred acres of land in the County of Chester beginning at a white oak at the Corner of a Tract of Land laid out to the Children of Thomas Musgrave deceased thence Extending by the said land north 240 perches to a chesnut tree thence East three perches to a white oak. Then North by the Proprietary's land 240 perches to a Chesnut tree. Then west by Vacant land 235 perches to a Hickery tree Then by other Land of the said Pike, south 480 perches to a Corner stone Thence by Vacant land and by the land of the said Musgraves Children east 232 per. to the beginning Surveyd by Isaac Taylor
