By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Melker Penerman now of the Township of Strsburg that we would grant him to take up in or near the said Township the quantity of five hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietrs use Fifty Pounds Money of this Province for the whole and the Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Melker Penerman in or near the place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Five hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Melker fulfill the above agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 27th day of September Anno Dni. 1717.
