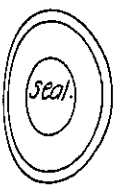


Pensilvania ss.

Upon an Agreement made with Robert Pile for two hundred Acres of Vacant Land in Bethel Township adjoining on the Land formerly Granted & confirmed by us for 200 Acres to Jn<sup>o</sup> Gibbons for which the s<sup>d</sup> Robert has agreed to pay to the Proprietors use according to a former Contract Sixty Pounds of the old Currency upon or before y<sup>e</sup> first day of December next. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the said Robt. Pile the said quantity of two hundred Acres of vacant Land in the place aforesaid and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>o</sup> the first day of the fourth Month 1709.
