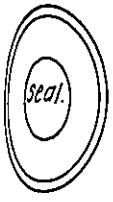


Pensilvania (obl.)



William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Governour in Chief of the Province of Pensilvania and Courtes annexed.

At the Request of David Powel of Bristol Township Yeoman That I would grant him to take up two hundred and forty two Acres of Land ~~are~~ by him bought of Edward Lane, one hundred ninety and two thereof in right of the s^d ~~Edward~~ Edward's Father, William Lane, Purchaser of 500 Acres and the other fifty in right of Walter King purchaser of one thousand Acres. These are to require three forth wth to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the s^d David Powel according to the Method of Townships by me appointed the s^d Number of Acres of Land in this Province not already survey'd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by the Indians, and make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philad^{ia} the 11th of 8^{br} 1701.
