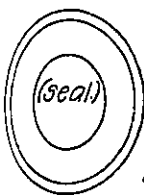


Pensylvania ss.



By the Commissioners of Property.

Upon an agreement made with Christian Penerman & John George Trelinger who lately arrived here from Germany, for six hundred Acres of Land to be laid out to them between the French Creek and the River Schuylkill, for which they are to pay to the Prop<sup>r</sup>s use ninety pounds Money of this Prov<sup>ce</sup> for the whole and the yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres These are to authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Christian Penerman and John George Trelinger in the place aforesaid according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of six hundred acres of Land that hath not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretary's, which Survey after date hereof in case the said Christian Penerman and John George Trelinger or either of them pay down at the Survey of y<sup>e</sup> above said Land five and Forty Pounds and <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> rem- ainder within six months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted, Given un- der our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> of x<sup>th</sup> A.D., 1717.
