



The Governour's Mannor.

A Draught of a Tract of Land situate on the south side of Brandywine Creek in the County of Chester surveyed the 15th day of the 2^d month 1701 unto Christopher Pennock in right of Francis and George Rogers first purchasers of five thousand acres by them sold to George Collett the said Christopher Pennock's father in law who bequeathed his whole right therein to the said Christopher Pennock and his sons, containing five hundred acres, pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 20th day of the 10th month 1700, and is accordingly Returned into the Secretary's Office the 25th day of the 4th month 1701.
