

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 20th day of the 10th month 1700.

I do hereby certify that I have caused to be surveyed unto Christopher Pennock a certain Tract of Land situate on the South Side of Brandywine Creek in the County of Chester in right of Francis and George Rogers first purchasers of five thousand acres by them sold to George Collett the said Christopher Pennock's Father in Law, who bequeathed his whole right therein to the said Christopher Pennock and his Sons, beginning at a Corner hickery being also a Corner of John Sharpless's Land, from thence West two hundred perches by a Street or Road to a Corner post, from thence South four hundred perches to a Corner post standing in the Line of the Proprietary and Governour's Manor, from thence by the said Line East two hundred perches to a Corner post, being also a Corner of Caleb Pusey's Land from thence North four Hundred perches to the before mentioned hickery, containing five hundred acres Laid out the 15th day of the 2^d month 1701, and Returned according to the above said survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governour's Secretary's Office the 25th day of the 4th month 1701. *Edw^d Penington Surv^r Gen^l*

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this second day of October, 1909.
