hundred Acres of Land purchased by her late husband of James Read my former
Gardiner or his Executors to whom I granted for his Services five hundred Acres one
hundred thereof in Bucks, and the othe-400 in Chester County: These are to require
thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed to the s^d Hannah Musgrove the s^d
Number of four hundred Acres of Land in the s^d County of Chester or else where
where it has not been already surveyd nor taken up nor concealed nor seated by
the Indians, She or her Assign Seating and Improving y^e same within twelve
Months after y^e date of Survey, and make returns thereof into my Secretaries
Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philad^a the Second of y^e fourth
Month 1701*
