At the request of Jeremiah Jerman of the County of Chester That we would Grant him Two Hundred Acres of Land joyning on the Tract which he now holds in or near Yughland in the said County for which he Agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Twenty five Pounds Money of this Province ^{with the usual Quitrent} These are to Authorize and Require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd to the s^d Jeremiah according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Two Hundred Acres of Vacant Land in the s^d place if there to be found, not already Survey'd nor seated by the Indians, and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office Which ~~Agrees to the~~ Survey if the said Jeremiah fulfill the said Agreement within three Months after y^e said Survey is made shall be Valid otherwise the same together with this Grant is to be utterly Void Given under our hands and Seals at Philad^{ia} the tenth day of the Eleventh Month (Jan^{ry}) A.D. 171⁴
