At the Request of Margaret John of Merion in this Province That we would Grant her to take up among the late Surveys made back in Chester County the quantity of four hundred Acres of Land for which She agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees <sup>of this Province</sup> fforty Pounds Mony of Pennsylvania for the whole and the yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Margaret John among the said later Surveys according to the Method of Townships the said quantity of ffour hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Margaret fulfill the above agreement within three Months after y<sup>e</sup> date hereof shall be Valid otherwise y<sup>e</sup> same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given und<sup>r</sup> our hands and y<sup>e</sup> Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 18<sup>th</sup> day of Novemb<sup>r</sup> Anno D<sup>ni</sup> 1718
