Whereas <sup>John</sup> John Little obtained a Warr<sup>t</sup> from the Commissioners dated the 20<sup>th</sup> of the 4<sup>th</sup> Month 1712 for two hundred acres of Land in the Mannor of Rocklands Joyning or near to the Land laid out to John Pierce These are to desire thee to Survey to the said John Little John the said Quantity of two hundred acres in the place aforesaid or near it in the said Mannor according to thy Discretion where Clear of other Surveys and Claims for which he agrees to pay Sixty pounds at the time of Survey or Intrest from that time for the Same as it is now concerted by the Secretary and him; the times of Payment Mentioned in the said Warr<sup>t</sup> being Elapsed; and make a Return into my Office
