

Pursuant to a warrant under the hands of the Commiss^{rs} of Property and the seal the province bearing date the 17th day of the 10th 1701 Granting unto George Lea two hundred acres of Land to be survey'd and Laid out in the Mattior of Rocklands adjoining on the Land of Nathaniel Newlitt on the south east side thereof There is Survey'd and Laid out unto George Lea two hundred acres of Land in the Mattior of Rocklands in the County of Chester beginning at a Chestnut tree in the line of Concord Township at the Corner of Nathaniel Newlitt's Land from thence extending south twenty four degrees easterly in the said Concord Line seventy five perches and a half to a White oak from thence West south West by vacant Land three hundred seventy eight perches to a black oak in the Line dividing the Counties of Chester and Newcastle Thence in the said Line North eighty degrees westerly eight six perches to a post from thence North North east by Nathaniel Newlitt's Land thirty nine perches to a Corner post from thence by the said Newlitt's Land east north east four hundred twenty five perches to the place of Beginning
