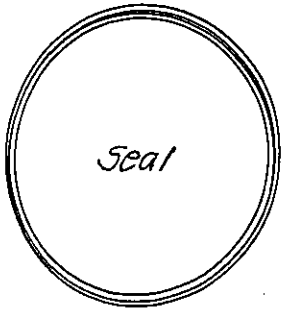

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> in Chief of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties annexed

Whereas there is a certain Tract or parcel of Land Situate in Concord Township in the County of Chester between the Lands of Morgan Jones and John Mettenhall and adjoining on the Street of the s<sup>d</sup> Township reputed to contain one hundred Acres or thereabouts, which said Tract John Lee has requested that I would grant <sup>to</sup> him upon Purchase, These therefore are to require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the s<sup>d</sup> John Lee the said Tract of Land as tis now bounded and Limited by the old Lines of Survey of the Lands adjacent, and make returns thereof into my Secretaries Office in order to a Confirmation of the same unto him. Given under my hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1701
