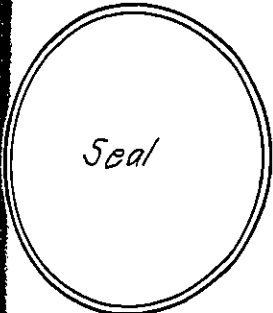

*At the Request of David Lewis That I would grant him a Resurvey on a certain
Tract of Land Situate in Haverford Township in the County of Chester, ^{on which he is now seated} reputed to
contain three hundred and forty five Acres, one hundred thereof being part of
Morris Llewellyn's purchase, and 145 part of John Bevan's purchase, the Remainder
of Lewis David's. These are to Require thee to Resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd the
said Tract according to the first bounds and True lines of Survey and make Returns
thereof into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philad^{ia}
the 15th day of the First Month 1709*
