


By Vertue of a Warrant under the hands of the Commiss^{rs} of Property and the seal of the Province dated the 13th day of the 2^d month 1702 Granting unto Thomas Norbury of Newtown in the County of Chester a Resurvey on one hundred seventy five acres of land laid out in the said Township by vertue of two warrants from the Proprietary and lately again Granted by him to the s^d Thomas and now in his possession

Resurvey'd unto Thomas Norbury a Tract of land in Newtown in y^e County of Chester beginning at a Walnut tree at the Corner of Daniel Williamsons land from thence Extending south fifty five degrees westerly by the said Williamsons land seventy one perches to a Rock Then South twenty four degrees east thirty nine perches to a small hickory tree again by the said Daniel Williamsons land south fifty five degrees west five hundred and thirty perches to a Chestnut tree by Crum creek then down the s^d Creek forty nine perches to a white oak Then by J^r Finchers land north fifty five degrees east five hundred ninety nine per^s to a white oak Then north twenty four degr^s westerly eighty nine perches to the Beginning Containing two hundred acres Resurvey'd by Isaac Taylor the 31st of 5^{mo} 1702
