By the Commissioners of Property.

At the request of George Herron of Cheltenham in the County of Philadelphia that We would Grant him two Hundred Acres of Land the back part of the Lot laid out to the Proprietary at Manatawny for which he agrees to pay to the Use of the Trustees Thirty pounds Money of Pennsylvania and the yearly quitrent of ~~one~~ Two Shillings Sterling for y^e whole These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey and lay out or cause to be Surveyed & laid out unto the Said George Herron at y^e most remote end of the Said Lot in a Regular piece with ~~as~~ as little Injury to the remaining part thereof as may be, the said quantity of Two hundred Acres of Land and make Returns of the Same into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further confirmation which Survey in case the said George fulfill the above agreement within three Months after y^e date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warr^t ever granted. Given under our Hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the first day of November Anno D^{omi}ni 1718.
