

Surveyd the 28th of the 8th Month 1717 Pursuant to the Commissioner's Warr^t
 dated the 18th of September 1717 unto Samuel Nut a Certain Tract or Parcel of Land
 on a Small Branch of the French Creek in the County of Chester Beginning
 at a Spanish Oak on the South side of the said Branch Thence East by North
 by a Line of Marked trees Two hundred sixty five perches to a post Then South
 by East by a Line of Marked trees one hundred and Sixty perches to a Post
 Then West by South by a line of Marked trees Two hundred Sixty five perches
 to a hickory Thence North by West by a Line of Marked trees one hundred
 and Sixty Pches to the place of Beginning Containing Two hundred and
 sixty fifty acres with the usual allowance of Six acres per Cent
