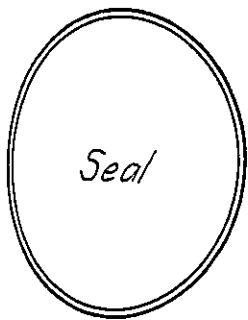

*By the Commissioners of Property*

*At the request of Samuel Nuttall of Chester County that We would Grant him to take up near the branches of the French Creek the quantity of Eight hundred Acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to y<sup>e</sup> use of y<sup>e</sup> Trustees Eighty Pounds M<sup>o</sup>ny of Pennsylvania for the whole & the Yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Surveyd unto the Said Samuel Nuttall at or near y<sup>e</sup> Place aforesaid according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Eight hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Surveyd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office. which Survey in case the said Samuel fulfill the above agreement within three Months after y<sup>e</sup> date hereof shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made or this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 2<sup>d</sup> day of Octob<sup>r</sup> Anno D<sup>ni</sup> 1718*
