



Pursuant to a warrant from ye Comiss<sup>rs</sup> of prop<sup>ty</sup> bearing dat<sup>y</sup> 13. 2. 1702 directed unto me: I do Certiefy that I have Resurveyd unto John Hugh: a Certain tract of Land on ye west sid<sup>e</sup> of Scoolkeel being part of 1000 acres Claimed by ye widow yocumms within ye bounds of Litticia Penns Manor beginneing at a stake set in ye ground being a Cor<sup>ner</sup> of said yocumms Land then by a line of trees North North west: 123 perches to a stake set in ye Line of Gunn: Rambos Land then by a Line of trees and ye Same Land West South West 335 ~~perches~~ perches to a dead ok Saplin marked from there South South East: by a Line of marked trees 123 perches to a stake set in ye ground by Vacant Land then East North East ~~123 perches~~ 335 perches to ye place of beginneing Containeing 257 acres of Land and is according to ye bounds above described Resurveyd ye 4<sup>th</sup> of ye 6. mo<sup>o</sup> 1703 and Returnd into the Generall Survey<sup>rs</sup> office ye 9<sup>th</sup> day of the same mo<sup>o</sup>.
