



26<sup>th</sup> of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1714 surveyed the above tract of land for Andrew Robinson situated on the east side of Scoolkel beginning at a black walnut marked for a corner near the ford where the old Road leads to Turpahocking from thence N.W. by W. by a line of marked trees 200 perches to a black Oke marked from thence N.E. 380 perches to a post and S.
