


By vertue of a warr^t from ye Com^{rs} dated ye 20th of ye 4th m^a 1691 directed to
ye survey^t Generall I do by authority from him certifie in to ye secretaryes office,
that there was surveyed and laid out ye same day unto Patrick Robinson
two lotts on ye bank of Philadelphia (one whereof was formerly laid out to
Timothy Clements and by him sold to ye said Robeson) both of which con-
taineth in breadth thirty ffoot and lyeth directly oppositt one to ye other
The length whereof as followeth ffrom ye Delaware ffront street to a
street of thirty ffoot broad on ye afore said bank one hundred and fifty
foot then ffrom y^e east side of y^e said street ffourty-five ffoot to anoth'r street of thirty ffoot
broad running under ye said bank Then ffrom ye east side of ye same
one hundred seventy-five ffoot in to the River Delaware so that ye whole
length of ye afore said lott is three hundred and seventy ffoot and is bound
ed northward with vacant lotts eastward with ye river Delaware at ye
afore said extent southward with Jerry my Elfreth's lotts and to ye
westward with Delaw^r ffront street which is accordingly entred and
recorded in ye survey^t Generall's office at Philadelphia ye 6th 5th m^a
