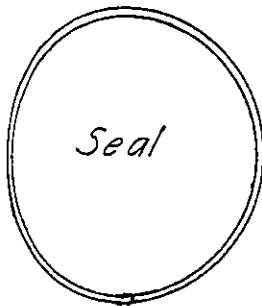

Province of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.*

*At the Request of Richard Haines by his Attorney Edw^d Singleton That I would
grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in right of Matthias Marks Old
Purchaser of five Thous^d Acres, These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or
cause to be Survey'd unto him the said Number of Acres of Land in this Province
not already taken up Survey'd nor concealed, to be laid out according to the Method
of Townships by me appointed: He taking out a Patent for the same within three
Months after thou shalt make Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office, which
thou art hereby required to doe with all convenient Speed. Given under my Hand
& Seal at Pensbury the 2^d day of the 7th Moth 1700*
