



Surveyed by Virtue of a warrant from William Penn being date the 12 day of the 10 month in 1700 and by an order from Jacob Taylor to me directed being in Right of the heirs dat April the 24: 1730 to Isack Samuels in Bucks County this Tract of Land beginning at a black oak standing on the North side of a branch of Delaware near a Little Stone hill. Galed Socukcutk then South East one hundred and thirty top perches obl vacant Land to a post then North East one hundred and thirty three perches by vacant Land to another post then North west by Joseph Samuels Land one hundred and thirty two perches to a whit oak then South west one hundred and thirty three perches by vacant Land to the place of beginning containing one hundred and fifty acres of Land with usual allowance Surveyed the first of May in 1730 in Bucks County by me
