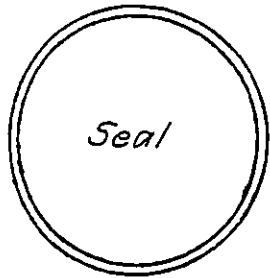

*William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> in Chief of the Province  
of Pensilvania and Counties Annexed.*

*At the Request of Rich<sup>d</sup> Haines by his Attorney Edward Singleton, That I would grant him  
to take up fifty Acres of Land in the Liberties of the City of Philadelphia in right of a  
Purchase of two thousand five hundred Acres by him made of Matthew Marks first  
Purchaser of five thousand Acres, of which 2500, two thousand four hundred and fifty  
Acres are already granted to be taken up, These are to require thee forthwith to Survey  
or cause to be Survey'd to the said Richard Haines the s<sup>d</sup> Number of fifty Acres of  
Land within the said Liberties, where it is not already Survey'd or laid out, He taking  
a Patent for the same within three Months after thou makes Returns thereof into my  
Secretaries Office, w<sup>ch</sup> thou art hereby required to doe w<sup>th</sup> all Convenient Speed.  
Given under my hand and Seal at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 12<sup>th</sup> day of the 10<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1700*
